## **Don't Miss The Wisconsin Technology Conference – August 7<sup>th</sup> in Ashland!**

Tying together education and economic development has been a quest for many in this region. However, I can't think of a more tireless advocate for the relationship than **Fred Tidstrom**. Ask him and he will remind you of his age referring to his body, but an encounter with his nimble mind will quickly dispel any suggestion that this retired dentist is over the hill and out of touch.

A Letter to the Editor, that Fred wrote, included reminders of accomplishments in the Ashland area that were the result of believing in a goal and working tirelessly to make it happen. His letter; "THERE IS A LIGHT AT THE GATEWAY TO THE TUNNEL," included two pieces that bear recognition and repetition:

- Imagine where we would be if we had not built MMC In October 2007 MMC will be designated a "CRITICAL ACCESS HOSPITAL". We have grown from two small hospitals with 11 Doctors into a Medical Center with a 60 Doctor staff and an affiliate hospital in Hayward.
- Imagine if we had not fought through seven bond referendums to change the form of school government, build a new Technical College and a new Ashland High School was it easy...hell no! We did it, just like the AHS football team that believed they could defeat the best team in the state who had been undefeated for 8 years & had the coach of the century in Wisconsin, Wim Brockmire. There are not many who remember these things, but I do!

One of Fred's projects involves the **Wisconsin Technology Council** and supports the **Lake Superior Chapter of WIN**, the **Wisconsin Innovation Network**. Each year the Lake Superior Chapter of WIN sponsors a Technology Conference. With leadership from Fred, **Clyde Eilo**, **Roger Hanson** and a large advisory team, the conference draws a robust audience from both inside and outside this immediate region.

Featured speaker this year is **Dr.Jim Hagstrom**, founder and vice-president of **Mirus Bio** in Madison. A native of Ashland, Hagstrom has led the science from the lab bench to the clinic. The companies slogan is "*It all begins at the bench*." Mirus Bio was recently acquired by **Roche**. The multi-billion dollar pharmaceutical giant made an impressive multi-million dollar purchase, and will honor the commitment Mirus Bio had made to remain in Madison. I met Hagstrom a few months ago, with an introduction by Tidstrom, and was greatly impressed by his sense that opportunities for biotechnology exist in our region. I am looking forward to Dr. Hagstrom's presentation.
